Motorola believes that good driving judgment is a skill that must be learned and maintained. When it comes to using wireless products in your vehicle, start with two basic rules:

- Know your vehicle. Be sure your vehicle's seat, steering wheel and mirrors are adjusted for your use. Know how to turn on lights, windshield wipers and other functions.
- Know your wireless product. You cannot learn how to operate your product while driving.

SAFE DRIVING TIPS

If you consider a call necessary...

Don't text while driving.

Don't place or answer a call during hazardous driving conditions or situations.

Don't take notes or look up phone numbers while driving.

Don't engage in emotional conversations. They are distracting and even dangerous when you are behind the wheel.

Do use a hands-free device; it is the law in most states.

Do secure your phone within easy reach.

Do let your voice mail answer your phone if you can.

Do let the person you are speaking to know you are driving and that you will suspend the call if a problem driving situation arises.

Do assess traffic before placing a call. Place calls when you are not moving or before pulling into traffic.

Do use your phone to call for help in an emergency. In the United States, dial 9-1-1 in the case of a fire, traffic accident, road hazard or medical emergencies. Remember, it is a free call on your wireless phone!
